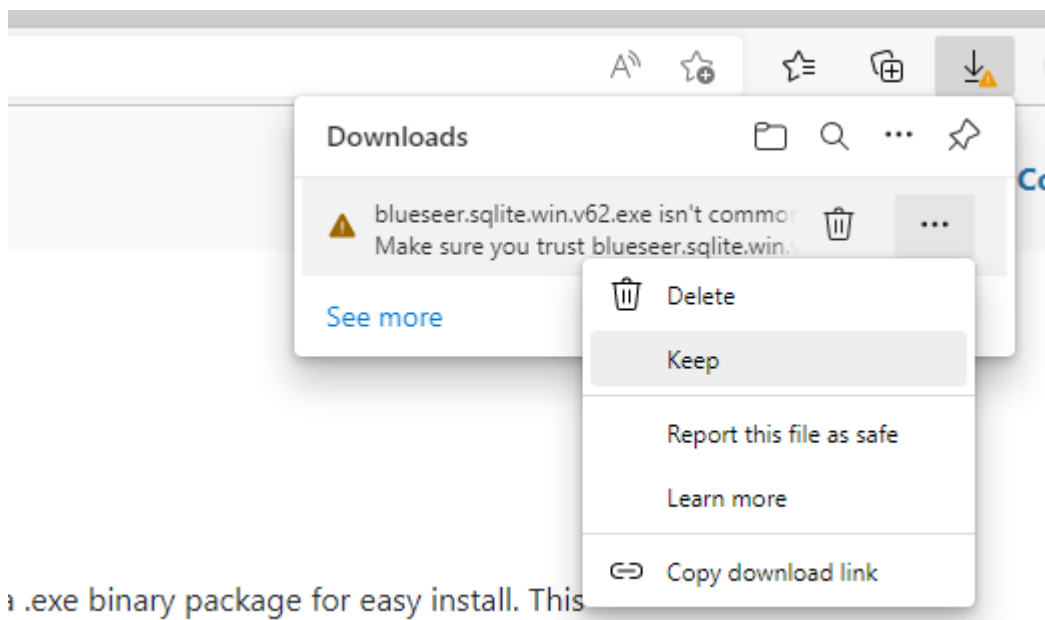


Downloading and Installing BlueSeer on Windows


Microsoft is making it considerably more difficult to download and install open source software with their constant warnings regarding signed/unsigned software. This is particularly the case with Windows 10.


To install BlueSeer, you will have to click through these 6 warnings (...yes 6....feel free to send a nasty email to Microsoft).

Upon download, you may see the warning "isn't a common download".
Click the *ellipsis* (three dots) to the right and click *Keep*.




Then the following may appear warning of whether or not the download is safe. Click the *Show more* drop down option.



Then, a warning from Microsoft asking if you want to keep, report, etc. Choose *Keep anyway*.

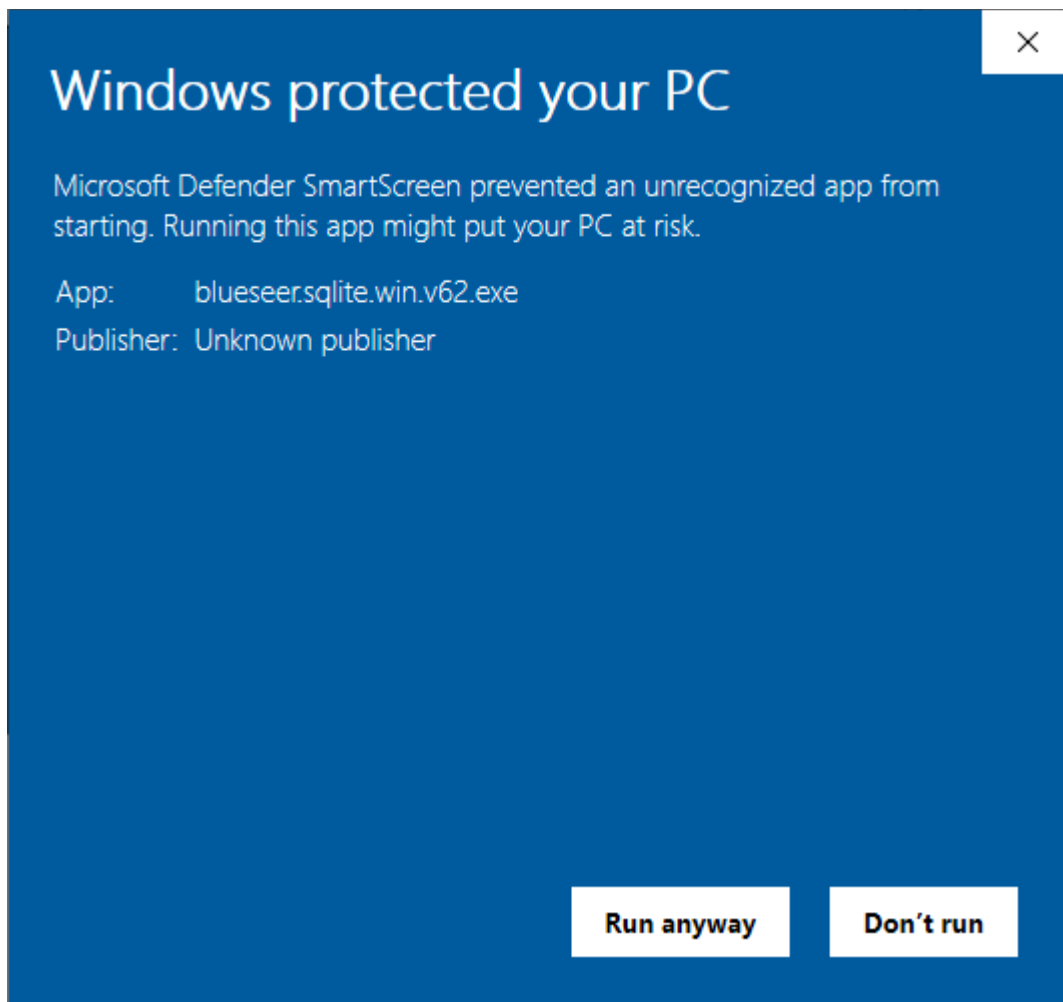

After Windows allows you to keep the file...it prompts you with still another warning that the application is unrecognized. Click the *More Info* hyperlink.



Almost there....a final warning from our beloved Microsoft asking you one more time if you want to install the application. Click *Run Anyway*.



Finally, it will prompt you with the familiar question of should you install from unknown publisher. Click *Yes*...and you should then proceed through the installation of BlueSeer. The actual installation takes a minute or two and will prompt you for the usual installation options.

Sadly...the time it takes to stumble through Microsoft's warnings exceeds the actual install time of BlueSeer. :(
